
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WHAT'S COMING IN THE NEW YEAR

Here's a short list of significant things to come:

A Revamp (for the good) of the WAHI Arbitration Program.

I believe our current program has been a huge success in the reduction of potential litigation cases against WAHI members. In recent months, however, WAHI has put a lot of time into reviewing several cases which were arbitrated. We have obtained feedback from the parties involved and we have consulted respected legal opinions. The outcome is that we need to revise the program to ensure it is fair and used as intended. Stay tuned for more info after the 1st of the year.

Changes to State Statutes and/or Standards Governing Home Inspectors.

• The work WAHI did regarding the changes relating to the definition of Defect was significant. A huge benefit of the effort is the positive relationship we developed with the Wisconsin Realtors Association (WRA). In our early conversations with the WRA, they inquired about creating a standardized home inspection report. After spending a fair amount of time on that, it is my opinion that all involved could see that this would be a daunting endeavor and take years to arrive at something acceptable to all. Based on casual conversations, I do feel some interest in a standardized report still exists for Realtors. Know that mention of a standardized summary page has been made - that may be a fair compromise in the future.

November 2018

- Fall 2018 Education House and Training Seminar: The Education House and Training Seminar was a GREAT success! Our thanks to our Education House Committee and volunteers crew, our Education Committee, our exhibitors, our speakers and our ATTENDEES! We couldn't do it without all of you! Mark your calendars for our Spring event...March 29th and 30th in Milwaukee.
- Website Polling Feature: Hopefully the Home Inspector members in WAHI participated in a test of a new feature of the website conducted November 28th thru December 1st. WAHI can now conduct surveys, hold elections, conduct Bylaws amendment approval, etc. through the WAHI website.
- WI State Statutes: WAHI stated, in writing, to the Department of Safety and Professional Services, Division of Policy Development, our support of the new definition of defect being incorporated into the Administrative Rule (and Standards of Practice) for home inspectors. This was an important final step to align the Statutes and the Administrative Rule.

December 2018 and Beyond...

- **December Chapter Meeting Changes:** Pay close attention to meeting announcements for December Madison and Milwaukee have changed things up a bit this month!
- 2019 State and Chapter Elections: It's time to give serious thought to the spring elections. All chapter officer positions (including Chapter-Elected Member at Large on the State Board) are up for election in odd numbered years. State President is up for election as well. All positions carry a 2-year term.
- Bylaws and Policy Manual: The amended Bylaws and new Policy Manual have earned Board of Director approval. Watch your email for important info—there will be a specific 2-week time period for discussion. Once any changes are discussed/finalized, the two documents will be put to vote by the members with voting rights (Home Inspectors and Retired members).

PRESIDENT (CONT'D)

Attempts by Some in the Legal Profession to Force Changes in our Liability.

- There are attorneys out there who long for the "good old days" when they could sue a home inspector and generate large monetary settlements for their clients and rack up large fees for themselves. Many changes imposed on us are not the result of legislation, enacted by elected officials who are held accountable by their constituents, but rather are decided by a court ruling which makes it the "new" law of the land (i.e. case law). It doesn't matter if the majority agrees or not. There often is no debate where all sides are heard and the majority opinion wins out. Special interest groups, with an agenda, force changes as a result of litigating a specific cause. Many times, the majority suffers in silence when the needs of a few (or the efforts of the powerful) outweigh the well-being of the majority. This sounds very political, but it is what happens.
- For home inspectors, some current legal action being sought would, in my humble opinion, greatly harm our profession. An increase in lawsuits with large monetary implications will have a huge impact on us. Every home inspector doing business has a stake in this and should plan on getting involved in some way on the effort to have some control of our fate. Stay tuned.

Long Term Planning.

• Change is the nature of any volunteer run organization. People come and go, and the priorities they have come and go with them. At the last Board meeting, the Board of Directors committed to creating a Long-Term Planning Committee. It is very important for the future success of WAHI that priorities don't just come and go with the turnover of leadership. We have already begun to identify a list of priorities - for example, a steady, dependable source of income, beyond dues, for WAHI to meet its budgetary needs.

Getting Involved In WAHI.

- Time for my regular plea to get involved in **your** association. Having been chair of the Nominations and Elections Committee for more years than I can remember, most of you have heard my spiel before. But...

WHY YOU NEED AN ARBITRATION CLAUSE IN YOUR PRE-INSPECTION AGREEMENT

Over a year after their inspection, one of our insureds received a letter from an attorney. The attorney alleged that the insured was negligent in performing the home inspection and failed to identify multiple defects. The letter demanded that the insured pay to cover the cost of repairs to multiple areas of the property. These included dormer repairs, window repairs, drywall repairs, mold remediation (even though it was not a mold inspection), flooring replacement, painting, toilet and sink re-installation, and heater repairs.



But the claimant and their attorney did not stop there. The letter also made a claim for reimbursement of alternative housing at a bed and breakfast while repairs were being made. (Yes, a bed and breakfast.)

As every home inspector should, our insured had had these clients-turned-claimants sign a contract prior to the inspection. And that pre-inspection agreement contained an arbitration clause....

The arbitrator issued a final and binding arbitration decision in favor of the insured based on the terms found within the pre-inspection agreement. The insured did not owe the claimants anything. The claimants did not receive so much as a dollar toward their repairs—nor their stay at the bed and breakfast.

Stories like the one above illustrate the importance of having an arbitration clause in your home inspection contract. An arbitration clause....requires claimants to resolve issues with the inspection through arbitration rather than mediation or litigation....

But what makes arbitration the preferred dispute resolution method for home inspectors?

DISPUTE PROCESS


All member-to-member or member-to-association disputes must go through the Membership Committee.
