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ARBITRATION UPDATE and DETAILS

I talked about the eminent revision of our WAHI Arbitration Program in my last newsletter article and we're now close enough to flesh out the new program!

First of all, claims handled by the new program will not take effect until you start using the revised WAHI Inspection Agreement (which will be distributed to all members in mid-April) naming the new program administrator. What this means is, that due to the 2 year Statute of Limitations in the State Standards, members will continue to work with Resolute Systems using the current WAHI arbitration program if that is in the agreement signed by you and your client.

Resolute Systems is not going anywhere, they are a successful nationwide arbitration and mediation service provider. It was decided that the goals of the WAHI Arbitration Program would be more effectively met using a new program administrator. I've said this many times and I strongly believe this the WAHI Arbitration Program has been a huge success in eliminating and reducing claims against WAHI Members. But, just like our autos - they keep producing new models with updated and improved features.

Feedback from several parties involved in WAHI arbitrations made us aware that some arbitrations were taking a path we did not intend. The Inspector Arbitrators didn't always follow the rules of the program, the available Contractor Arbitrator (at times) were not experts in the area of the dispute and the Neutral Arbitrator (the judge) would revert back to what they were familiar with rather than strictly following the rules of the WAHI program.

Another big reason for the change - most of our Chapters did not have enough qualified, trained Contractor Arbitrators in fields most often in dispute. When a claim came up, finding an arbitration panel was pretty tough, if not impossible. WAHI feels that the revised program will address these concerns.

PRESIDENT (CONT'D)

As a result of all of the above, WAHI decided to partner with Construction Dispute Resolution Services (CDRS). A significant difference in their program versus our current arbitration program is that CDRS uses a single Arbitrator, rather than a panel of 3. Arbitrators with CDRS must have knowledge in home construction. Resolute Systems could have provided a single arbitrator program as well, but with no guarantee the arbitrator would have a background in housing/construction disputes. Arbitrators provided through Resolute are typically retired judges or attorneys who may have little knowledge of the issues involving a house/home inspection. The current WAHI Arbitration Program was designed to address a judge's potential lack of knowledge in construction by adding a Home Inspector and Contractor Arbitrator to the panel to provide greater insight. But reports in recent years showed that while our program was very good on paper, it wasn't always happening at arbitration.

WAHI was referred to CDRS while working through how to resolve the shortcomings encountered in recent claims using the WAHI Arbitration Program. The original goals of WAHI align exactly with CDRS's goals:

- Provide a way to resolve disputes that is fair to both parties.
- Have claims handled in a timely manner and not drawn out, potentially for years.
- Rely on the State Statues and Standards of Practice, governing home inspectors, along with strictly adhering to the terms of the Inspection Agreement to judge the merits of the claim.
- Provide a cost effective alternative to litigation and minimize the additional costs of legal counsel and experts.

CDRS already had a few Arbitrators available in WI (Madison and Milwaukee) but WAHI wants statewide coverage to benefit all of our members. We are working with CDRS on their upcoming training program to ensure there are ample Arbitrators ready when needed.

Making the change to CDRS will also eliminate any conflicts of interest concerns as CDRS will not allow a WAHI member to serve as the Arbitrator on WAHI arbitrations.

While CDRS will not use a WAHI member to arbitrate a claim against a fellow WAHI Member, we encourage any member interested in adding Arbitrator to their resume, to explore the CDRS website and consider the <u>training</u> scheduled for April 11, 12, and 13th in Milwaukee.

I feel strongly that this new program will meet WAHI's goal to provide fair and cost effective claims management. The WAHI Inspection Agreement, which includes the Arbitration clause, is an amazing WAHI member-benefit for you! I personally would not do business without it and I hope WAHI members avail themselves of this great benefit!

STATE AND CHAPTER ELECTIONS





CALLING FOR WISCONSIN ARBITRATORS

WHO CAN SIGN MY PRE-INSPECTION AGREEMENT?

Two years after the inspection, a multiinspector firm received a county court summons. Within the summons, the inspection company's former clients made a litany of allegations....

To cover the supposed damages, the claimants demanded over \$100,000, plus whatever additional costs the claimants incurred during the lawsuit. In their contract, the inspection company had a limitation of liability clause to put a cap



on its financial responsibility for missing or omitting defects. But there was one problem: The clients never signed the pre-inspection agreement.

Your pre-inspection agreement is your contract between you (the home inspector) and your client (the person(s) for whom you are performing a property inspection). Its purpose is to protect both you and your client(s) by setting correct inspection expectations, including services you'll perform and payment(s) they'll make.

In order to adequately protect inspectors against claims and preserve insurance coverage, inspectors must get their agreements signed prior to the inspection 100 percent of the time. (Hence the "pre" in pre-inspection agreement. Learn more about the legal reasons why contracts need to be signed prior to inspections here.)

Recently, a home inspector asked:

"I have a real estate agent that sometimes pays for their clients' home inspection and also signs the pre-inspection agreement. If the buyer made a claim, would the insurance company defend me even though it was the real estate agent was the one who paid for the inspection and signed the agreement?"
